In May, our education programmes in Malawi continued to create meaningful impact - from early learning to adult empowerment.


Over 500 children attended our 13 Early Childhood Development (ECD) centres, where we supported daily meals and learning through the distribution of teaching materials and feeding utensils. Five centres harvested their maize and soya crops, now safely stored to reduce losses and support sustainable nutrition.


Meanwhile, adult literacy graduates in Biwi turned knowledge into income through soap-making cooperatives, and preparations began for two new literacy centres in response to high community demand.

Monthly Highlight | Adult Literacy

Two soap-making cooperatives reported strong early progress after our 2024 adult literacy business courses! Products are now selling in local markets, and the co-ops have already earned MWK 61,500 in just two months.

Sustainable Family Farms | Ngwizi Village Chancholo Centre

Our team visited Ngwizi village to check on harvests from the Sustainable Family Farms project. Nearly all participating families completed their maize harvests and stored them in granaries, preparing for shelling and loan repayment. All of our farmers in Ngwizi village harvested between 1 and 4 tons of maize each in May.
