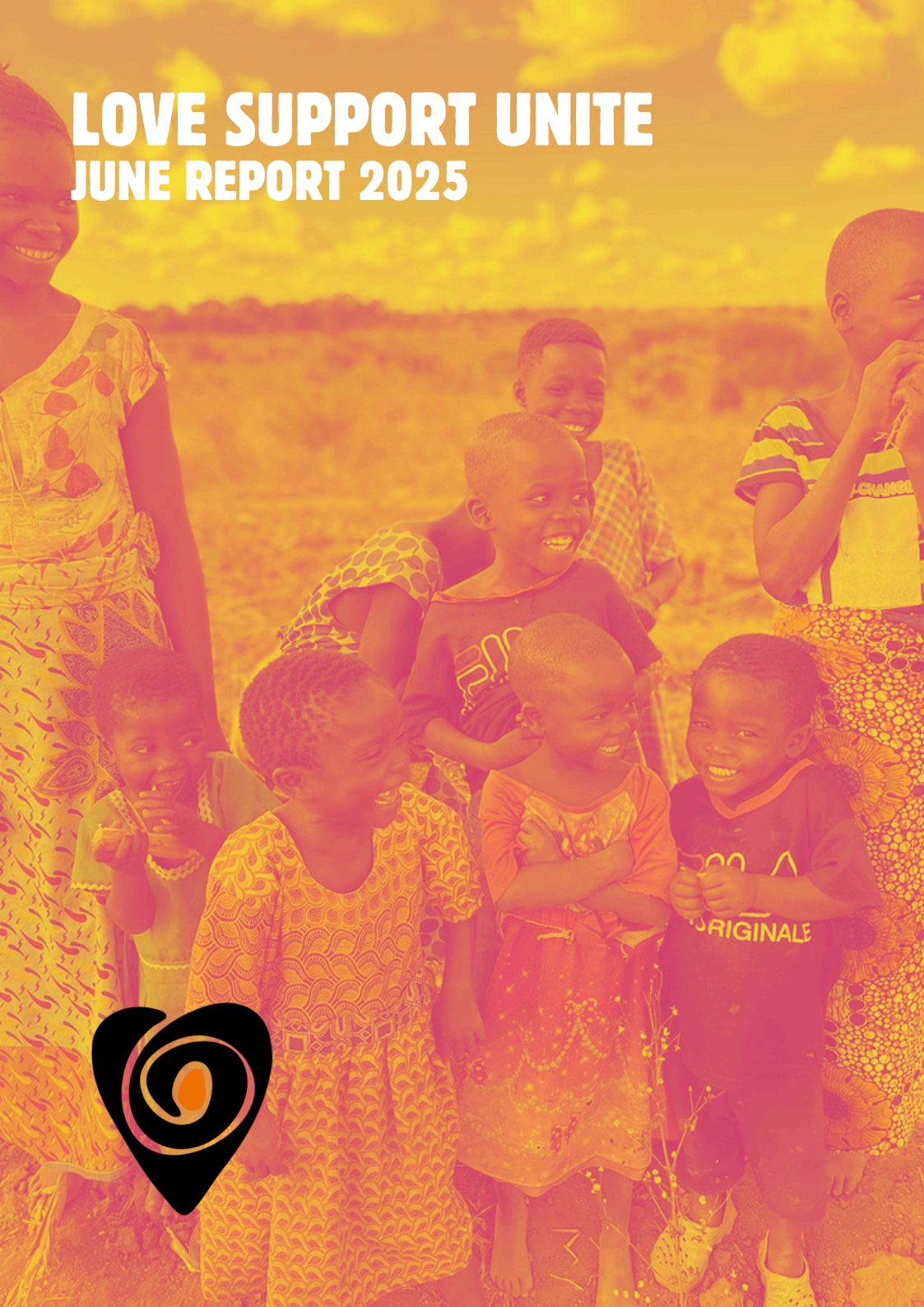

In June 2025, Love Support Unite is proud to celebrate another month of impact with our dedicated partners at African Vision Malawi. Across Education, Sustainable Agriculture, and Health, communities are not just receiving support—they are building knowledge, skills, and resilience that last a lifetime. From hands-on permaculture training and thriving early childhood centres to families empowered through Village Savings and Loans, we are witnessing transformation at every level.

Empowering Malawi's Future Through Education: Nurturing Minds, Building Dreams, and Breaking the Cycle of Poverty

In June 2025, the education sector recorded notable progress across its key programs: Early Childhood Development (ECD), Scholarships, and Adult Literacy. Average attendance at the **13 ECD centers increased from 516 in May to 593 in June**, largely due to the feeding program and porridge flour donations that boosted learner participation.

A caregivers' meeting held at Sam's Village on June 18 brought together **38 caregivers to share achievements**, discuss challenges, and plan for upcoming transitions, with active participation and teamwork observed throughout.

Additionally, the **scholarship program continued supporting learners in primary, secondary, and tertiary institutions**.

Overall, June's activities reflected **strengthened community engagement**, improved learner participation, and **responsive support to vulnerable beneficiaries**.

Supporting 47 caregivers/teachers through training, learning materials, feeding programs, and infrastructure support at ECD centres

100 adults learning literacy at 2 centres in Malawi, with 4 teachers trained

77 more children attended Early Childhood Development Centres, bringing a total of 593 little learners this month



Our Orphan & Vulnerable Children & Adults program supported 14 households with monthly food packs containing maize, beans, cooking oil, soap, and other essentials.

Launched 2 maternal health projects that promote sustainable family health and resilience

Across Malawi, access to maternal care is safeguarding mothers and nurturing new beginnings.

In June 2025, our organisation delivered essential health and social services to rural communities through mobile clinics, disability support, and family strengthening programs. Despite a **9.7% reduction in attendance** due to local cultural activities, our programs **reached 2,851 people**, providing **life-saving care, education, and support to vulnerable families.**

Our interventions strengthened **maternal and child health, improved disability care access**, and provided **nutrition and livelihood support for 14 vulnerable households**. We also launched **two key maternal health initiatives** - the **Safe Motherhood Project** and the **Mother & Infant Pilot Project**- that will have a lasting impact on family well-being in the communities we serve.



Building self-sufficiency, improving food production, and fostering long-term resilience among vulnerable rural families.

In June 2025, our Agriculture and Permaculture initiatives advanced household food security, ecological awareness, and financial empowerment in rural communities.

Through hands-on permaculture training and Sustainable Family Farms (SFF) activities, participants gained practical skills in organic farming, composting, seed preservation, animal integration, and financial literacy.

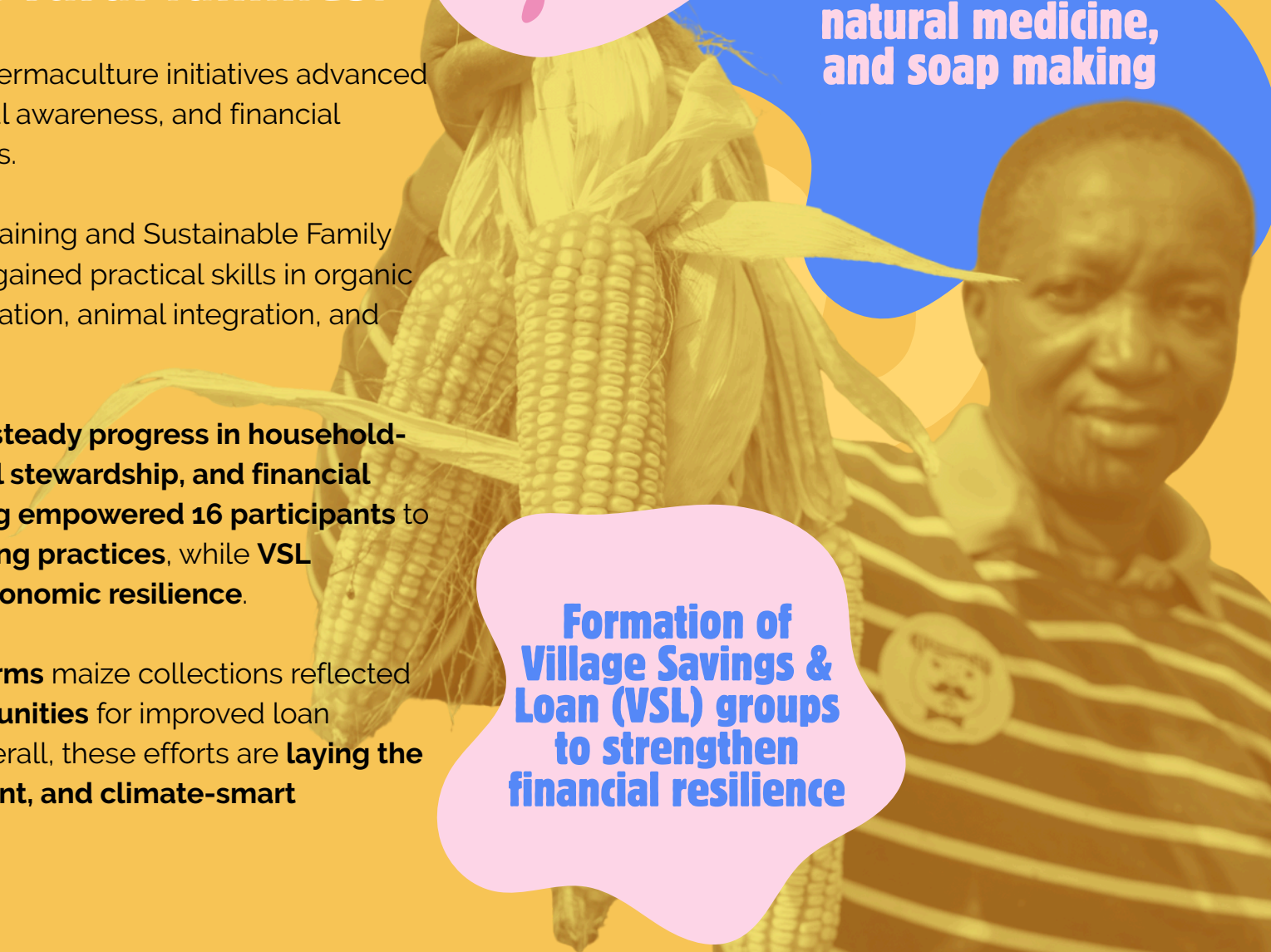
The month of June demonstrated **steady progress in household-level food security, environmental stewardship, and financial literacy**. Our **permaculture training empowered 16 participants** to adopt **sustainable, low-cost farming practices**, while **VSL activities created pathways for economic resilience**.

Meanwhile, **Sustainable Family Farms** maize collections reflected both **success and learning opportunities** for improved loan recovery and crop productivity. Overall, these efforts are **laying the foundation for healthier, self-reliant, and climate-smart communities**.
