



**LOVE SUPPORT UNITE  
MARCH REPORT 2026**



**This March, our team delivered 8 Mobile Outreach Clinics across rural communities in the Lilongwe district.**

**Since the programme began in April 2025, we have now reached over 26,000 people, a milestone we are incredibly proud of.**



**Services delivered this month included childhood vaccinations, malaria rapid diagnostic testing, HIV counselling and testing, family planning, antenatal care, and community health education sessions covering topics such as cholera, MPOX, malaria prevention, and sanitation and hygiene.**



- 2,315 people seen this month
- 1,372 children had their growth monitored, with 14 referred for nutritional support
- 323 malaria tests conducted, 19 positive cases identified and treated
- 76 HIV tests carried out

# Disability Outreach



- Disability clinic held at Chimbalu on 2nd March
- 10 clients seen – 3 new, 7 returning
- Referrals made to 500Miles for prosthetics, Kamuzu Central Hospital for further assessment, and Bwaila for continued care
- 1 adult referred for prosthetic leg repair from the SEND Unit




# Safe Motherhood Unit



- A new cohort of antenatal mothers attended nutrition lessons alongside their spouses
- This month's focus was on permaculture and nutrition – understanding macronutrients, micronutrients and how to grow food sustainably
- Training took place in the permaculture gardens

# Orphan and Vulnerable Children and Adults Project

- 14 households received food packs in February
- Families receiving maize, beans, cooking oil, soap and other essentials
- Notable updates — Fenita received a tricycle, Triphonia doing well and continuing education, Lawrence and Lulu (child-headed household) doing well in school



# SEND Clinic - M'bang'ombe Health Centre

- The SEND Unit provides physiotherapy, occupational therapy and speech and language therapy to children with disabilities
- 3 significant developmental milestones recorded this month; one child has achieved independent sitting for the first time, another child is now standing independently and one child is now crawling.
- Most parents are now carrying out home exercise programmes with their children
- Support group participation and peer connections continuing to strengthen
